Stavanger Exit Lists - <http://www.hist.uib.no/arkivverket/dnuEng.htm> This is a "synthetic" list and not a traditional exit list. It is made from other sources like parish utfylke lists. The list is somewhat more difficult to search than some other similar lists. If you do not find something where expected move up a level of governmental or religious unit and try again. This page also links to the Kristiansand and Kristiania/Oslo exit lists.

Rygh Farmnames - http://www.dokpro.uio.no/rygh_ng/rygh_form.html This is some of the data from the Rygh Volumes 1-17 (18 will follow later) that contain lists of all farms in Norway. The most important data for all the farms in the covered volumes is here, but many pictures and some ancillary information is only available in the books.
